1. Welcome: Jen Russomanno and Kimberly Pettigrew

Opportunity for everyone in room to introduce themselves and their organization; overview for guests of Food Policy Council; introduction of speakers

2. Presentation of City of Knoxville Food Systems Zoning, Codes, and More!: Jessie Hillman, Knoxville-Knox County Planning

Defined zoning as a tool in planning—regulatory tool to help in planning (what can be built and where). Land Use Classifications are used to connect zoning to community plans. City Code includes a Use Matrix—food pantries are only allowed as "special use" in C-G and C-H. "Special use" means an individual, group, etc. must go before planning commission to propose concept and use prior to approval. Community, market, and personal gardens are permitted in all zones in some form. Jessie created a guide that she will email out after this meeting.

3. Feedback Session for Urban Forest Master Plan: Kasey Krouse, City of Knoxville Knoxville TreePlan.org; Knoxville Plan—non-profit Trees Knoxville is leading project; sponsors are University of TN-Knoxville, City of Knoxville, TN Dept. of Ag, KUB, Keep Knoxville Beautiful; Urban Canopy Works—consultant from OH leading the process. Environmental, social, and economic benefits are considered in this plan. The goal is to not lose amenities that we receive from trees in our community. Tree canopy assessment was conducted in 2020 for a mapping of tree coverage across the city of Knoxville (tree cover, other green space, impervious surfaces, bare ground, water are all included in the mapping). Changes in tree cover from 2008 to 2018 were also considered. Trends for tree coverage by where minorities reside were part of the findings. Goal today is to receive input via provided survey. Public open house is scheduled for April 20, 2023. Kasey offered that if other organizations would like to have this presented at an event to let him know.
