2. Presentation: No Kid Hungry (Marissa Spady)

- In TN, 1 in 8 kids are facing hunger. No Kid Hungry is working to end childhood hunger by making sure every kid gets three meals a day.
- Share Our Strength is parent organization out of Washington, D.C.
- How No Kid Hungry works to end hunger: Grants, Research, Outreach, Training, Advocacy & Awareness
- Text "Food" or "Comida" to 304-304 to find free, healthy meals in specific communities.
- Food Insecurity by region: 44.7% in West TN, 37.5% in Middle TN, 43.7% in East TN
- Hunger is an education issue, a health issue, an economic issue.
- TN DHS and TDOE oversee federal meal programs in TN
- No Kid Hungry campaign in TN began around school breakfast (breakfast after the bell service models: grab & go carts, breakfast in the classroom, 2nd chance breakfast)
- CACFP Afterschool Meals (evening meal and/or snack): area eligible (50% or greater free/reduced) sites only.
- Summer Meals: open sites can serve any two of the following meals per day: breakfast, AM snack, lunch, PM snack, supper. Meals are free to any child 18 and under.
- How No Kid Hungry can help: individualized community assessment, promotion and marketing support, identify additional sites/sponsors in area, grant assistance, brainstorming, media.
- Child Nutrition Sponsor Gathering: 3rd Wednesday of each month at 10 AM EST (DHS joins for updates and opportunity for questions; share resources, grant opportunities, advocacy opportunities; opportunity to ask questions, learn from fellow sponsors)
- Mayors Alliance: individual and collective leadership of Mayors to take meaningful actions to end childhood hunger in cities nationwide. 220 mayors nationwide.
- New website has launched: Center for Best Practices

3. **Organizational Updates and Announcements:**

<u>Knox County Schools</u>—update on LINQ Connect-new free/reduced application portal; encouraged completion of applications; Medicaid matching project through TDOE to increase eligibility for free/reduced meals based on participation in Medicaid will begin next school year.

<u>American Heart Association</u>—wrapped up CPR/AED Awareness Week; partnered with Second Harvest for produce (used QR codes to direct to AHA recipes); cold storage applications are still open; collaboration with KCHD with selective food pantries to lead with a heart-healthy lens

KCDC—looking for organizational help with signup to help take residents grocery shopping; garden parties at all properties (looking for gardening supply donations); decline in population at Western Heights, Northgate under renovation, 5 Points has new management team, First Creek—opening waiting list for 180 units soon; July 6—Love Towers—ribbon cutting on health clinic; building first new property for Veterans only (**Nourish Knoxville**—full swing in farmers markets; all markets have officially opened and experiencing record days (last kids program—236 kids)

<u>Real Good Kitchen</u>—July "Pay what you can" fried chicken lunch (Daddy D's food truck participating); summer suppers on the road with indoor events

<u>Knoxville-Knox County Planning</u>—staffing, new team member present today—more planners to do less reactive planning and more long-range planning/community engagement; Hailey Lewis is interning with a focus on how planning/zoning impacts food access
